

Credit Card Mania

Characters: Rosa, May, Melody, Shopgirl/Waiter/Salesgirl

Synopsis: May gets herself a new credit card. Rosa warns her against the dangers

of credit cards but May assures her she will use it sensibly. May and Melody go shopping in Fabulous Walk. They watch a fashion show in the Mall and then go clothes shopping. May is persuaded to buy quite a lot of expensive clothes. As May learns to use her card she starts to loosen up and buy more and more things until her shopping spree turns

into a shopping mania!

Scene 1

May: Hey girls... look what I've got!

Melody: Wow... May! A credit card!

Rosa: Dangerous.

May: But great for shopping. Rosa: When did you get it?

May: Just to-day... it came in the post... all I have to do is sign the back and

then I can start using it.

Melody: That's gonna be so handy.

May: Why don't YOU get one Melody.

Rosa: I haven't got enough money... you need to have over a certain amount

in the bank to get one and I've got... Well... pretty much nothing.

May: I know but this is a new deal... it's from Blank Bank.

Rosa: Blank Bank?! Who are they May?

May: It's this new Bank... and to attract new customers they're offering

credit card to students on special terms... so you DON'T have to have

thousands of dollars in your account to get one.

Rosa: I've never heard of Blank Bank before.

May: Neither have but the other day I was given one of their leaflets and

when I saw how easy it was to get a credit card with them I went along

to the nearest branch and got one.

Rosa: Just like that?!

May: Yes, it was easy... I just had to sign a few papers, you know the usual

thing and look... they've sent me a card.

Melody: Let's see... Mmmm... it's very pretty... it's got a teddy bear on it.

May: And look on the back.

Melody: Ah... what a sweet little pussy cat.

Rosa: Hm... it looks more like a toy than a credit card.

Melody: I think it's cute.

Rosa: May... are you SURE you really need a credit card.

May: It'll be handy Rosa... I won't have to carry cash around with me.

Rosa: But at least with cash you know how much you've spent.

Melody: I wonder if I should get one.

Rosa: Don't Melody.

Melody: Why not? May's got one.

Rosa: Yes but May's more sensible than you... you're a spendthrift.

Melody: No I'm not.

Rosa: I've never had a credit card and I have to say I don't think I've ever

really needed one.

May: Okay so what if you see something you want to buy and you haven't

got the cash on you... you can just pull out your Blank Bank card and

get it on the spot.

Rosa: What's wrong with going to an ETC machine and getting some money

out?

May: Takes time.

Rosa: But at least it gives you time to think about if you can really afford

what it is you are about to buy.... With a credit card you might buy

something on the spot and regret it later.

Melody: Impulse buying.

Rosa: Exactly Melody... impulse buying... buying stuff on the spot that you

don't really want or need.

May: I'm not like that Rosa... I only buy stuff I need.

Rosa: Okay but that was before you had a credit.... Things could change once

you discover how easy it is to buy things by just flashing that cute little

teddy bear card.

May: I won't Rosa.

Melody: It is such a cute card... I love it.

Rosa: Well I think it looks like a toy... are you sure they're not asking you to

pay in toy money May?

May: (Laughing) I wish they were.

Melody: What's your credit limit?

May: A hundred thousand.

Rosa: A hundred thousand dollars?!

May: Yes.

Rosa: That's crazy!
May: Is it Rosa? Why?

Rosa: Because you're only a student!

May: But that's why the bank gave me a high credit rating... they said as an

undergraduate I would soon be working as a professional and earning a good salary... they said giving me this card was a recognition of my

future potential.

Rosa: That's just sales talk May.

Melody: Is it Rosa... it kind of makes sense, I can see what they mean... like

May IS going to get a good job one day and then she WILL be earning

a big salary.

Rosa: One day Melody.... One day I agree... but at the moment she's only a

student.

May: Don't worry about me Rosa.... look, I'll be careful okay?

Rosa: Do you know how much interest they charge on those cards?

May: Um... not sure... the standard bank rate I guess.

Rosa: No May... they charge much more than that. It can be as

much as ten percent or more.

May: Anyway... it doesn't matter what they charge because I'll always be on

time with my payments.

Rosa: You must May... instruct your bank to pay off your credit account bill

every month so the debt doesn't mount up.

Melody: But what's the point of having a credit card if you do that?

Rosa: Melody... Don't encourage May to get into debt!

Melody: I'm not.... I'm only saying that.... well... if you have a credit card than

you might as well use it.

Rosa: May... why don't you... give it back.

May: Give back my credit card?! But I've only just got it! I haven't even used

it yet.

Melody: And it's so pretty.... How can she give back such a pretty card.

Rosa: Look, I've got some scissors... I can cut it up for you.

Melody: No... don't cut up that pretty card.... That poor teddy bear... you'll cut

his head off and the pussy cat... she's sweet... you can't cut her up

Rosa: Oh for heaven's sakes Melody.... I'm trying to help May and all you can

do is go on about the cute teddy bears and pussy cats on the damn credit card! Well they won't be so cute if May runs up a big bill she

can't pay back.

May: Rosa... thanks for your concern... I appreciate it but... I'm going to be

sensible... okay... I'll use my credit card only when I really have to.

Rosa: I hope so May, I really hope so.

Scene 2

(SFX: Sounds of big shopping mall. There is a fashion show going on in the Mall so there is pop music in the background)

Melody: I love Fabulous Walk!

May: So do I.

Melody: There's so many fabulous shops.

May: I know... and new ones opening all the time.

Melody: And free fashion shows!

May: I know... shall we go and have a look?

Melody: You bet... come on.

(SFX: Pop music from the fashion show a bit louder as they get closer to the show)

May: Wa.... Look at that model Melody.

Melody: She looks fantastic!

May: I love that top she's wearing.

Melody: I know... it goes really well with the trousers,.

May: I love the colour.

Melody: You'd look good in top and trousers May.

May: D'you think so?

Melody: Yes, you'd fantastic!

May: But you've got to be slim to wear something like that.

Melody: But you ARE slim May.

(SFX: More music)

May: Wa! Look at this model coming down the cat walk now.

Melody: I love that skirt.

May: Me too.

Melody: And those shoes she's wearing.

May: They really go with the skirt don't they.

Melody: Yes, a perfect match.

May: And that blouse she's wearing with it.

Melody: I really like the cut.

May: Me too... it's simple but nicely cut... it looks kind of classy.

Melody: I love it.

May: Which do you prefer... that top and slacks the first model is wearing or

the blouse and skirt the second model is wearing.

Melody: Here come another model and look what SHE'S Wearing! Oh May I

love it.

May: I love the colour. Melody: And the style.

May: Any one would look good in that.

Melody: Not too tight.

May: But well cut... Wow, I wonder who the designer is?

Melody: Chang and Lee.
May: Chang and Lee?

Melody: Yes... they're really hot... a friend of mine bought a Chang and Lee top

the other day and as soon as I saw her I said... Wa... you look great... and she just pointed to her top and said... "Chang and Lee"... I don't know what it is but clothes from Chang and Lee just make any girl

(SFX: Music form the fashion show. Fade)

Scene 3

Melody: Look... they've got that top in the window... The one that model was

wearing.

May: And the trousers.

Melody: And there's the skirt.

May: Gorgeous aren't they.

Melody: Oh yes.

May: But they don't say how much they cost.

Melody: No. Um, shall we go in and ask.

May: (Nervous) Ask?

Melody: Or we could just look on the labels.

May: Do you think we should?

Melody: Why not?

Scene 4

(SFX: As they enter the boutique we hear the music that is being played inside the shop)

Melody: (Whisper) Nice shop May: Gorgeous clothes.

Melody: Look, there are the tops hanging up over there... let's go look at the

label and see how much they cost.

May: Okay.

(SFX: More music)

Salesgirl: Can I help you?

May: Oh... we were just looking.

Salesgirl: What size are you?

May: Um... eight.

Salesgirl: That's a ten you've got there.

May: Is it?

Salesgirl: Here's an eight.

May: Oh, yes, thanks.

Salesgirl: The changing rooms are through there.

May: Changing rooms?

Melody: Go on May... no harm in just trying it on.

May: Um... okay.

Salesgirl: Do you want to try anything else one while you're there?

Melody: Can she try on those trousers?

May: (Shocked) Melody!

Salesgirl: Of course... these ones you mean?

Melody: Yes, those are the ones aren't they May?

May: Um... yes.

Salesgirl: What size waist?

May: Twenty six.

Salesgirl: Twenty six.... In the black or the pink.

Melody: Try the pink ones on May.

May: Pink? Um... no.... I'll try on the black ones please.

Salesgirl: Black twenty eight and an eight top.

May: Thanks.

Salesgirl: Anything else?

May: No thanks.

Melody: Did you?

Melody: They are nice.

May: But...

Melody: Try it on May... just to see what it looks like.

Salesgirl: The changing rooms are through there.

May: Oh okay... thanks.

(SFX: More shop music as May is changing)

May: How do I look?

Melody: Oh May... you look fantastic!

Salesgirl: You do like nice... that style really suits you.

May: Does it?

Melody: You look like one of those models we saw on the cat walk.

May: I don't think so.

Melody: No you do May... doesn't she?

Salesgirl: You look very very nice... very modern and stylish.

Melody: Are the shoes comfortable?

May: Yes, yes they are.

Salesgirl: How about the top and pants?

May: Yes, they fit really well.
Melody: May... you look stunning.

Salesgirl: There's a mirror here.

Melody: Look... see how fantastic you look.

May: Yes, they're nice.

Melody: Now go and try on the skirt.

May: D'you think I should?

Melody: Of course.

Salesgirl: You do look nice.

Melody: The boys will be falling over themselves!

May: Okay.

(SFX: More shop music)

Melody: Wow! That skirt is perfect!

Salesgirl: It's a good fit.

Melody: You HAVE to have that May... you just HAVE to!

Salesgirl: Look in the mirror.

Melody: See May... wow... it is SO perfect.

May: Yes, it is nice.
Salesgirl: Good fit too.
May: Well um....

Salesgirl: Shall I wrap them for you?

May: Um...

Melody: You said your wardrobe needed updating.

May: I know.

Melody: Well... if you just buy the skit, pants, top and shoes.... You won't need

to buy anything else... and you do look gorgeous in them.

May: (Pause) Um... do you accept credit cards?

Salesgirl: Yes of course we do.

May: Um... okay then.

Melody: (Squeals with excitement) Oh May... How exciting!

Salesgirl: If you'd like to take the skirt off and hand it to me I'll pack everything

up for you, okay?

May: Yes of course.

(SFX: More shop music)

Salesgirl: There we are. And you... credit card.

May: It's a Blank Bank credit card... is that okay?

Salesgirl: Oh yes... absolutely.

May: Thanks. Salesgirl: Oh.

May: What... what is it?

Salesgirl: You haven't signed the back.

May: Oh.

Salesgirl: That's okay... just sign it now and that'll be fine.

May: Okay.

(Pause)

Salesgirl: That's it... now if you'll just sign here.

May: Um....

Salesgirl: Just at the bottom there.

Melody: It's so exciting! May: Is that right?

Salesgirl: Yes, that's fine, thank you Madam... and here are your things.

May: Thanks you.
Salesgirl: Goodbye.
May: Good Bye.

Melody: Bye!

(SFX: Shop music fades and shopping Mall ambient sound comes up)

Melody: Oh May... how exciting... you've got a complete new wardrobe and all

from Chang and Lee!... you'll be so hot!

May: I know... I went a bit mad.

Melody: It was worth it though.... Um... how much did it all come to?

May: I'm not sure.

Melody: Oh.

May: I didn't look, I was too busy signing here and signing there.

Melody: Well have a look now.

May: Um...

Melody: Just look on your credit card slip it will tell you how much you've paid.

May: Okay...

(SFX: Rustling of her credit card slip)

Melody: So how much did it all come to?

May: (Pause) That can't be right.

Melody: Chang and Lee aren't cheap you know.

May: You can say THAT again.

Melody: How much was it?

May: Six thousand three hundred and twenty two dollars.

Melody: (Pause) Let me see.

May: Oh dear... I've never spent that much on clothes before.

Melody: Well... it's not THAT bad... if you'd bought the same sort of things in

Arnolfinis's or Sheek de Sheek you would have paid twice as much.

May: Really? Melody: Easily.

May: (Pause) But... (Gulps) Six thousand three hundred dollars... for a top

and...

Melody: Pants and a skirt and shoes.... That's not bad and it IS Chang and Lee

May.

May: Yes, yes I suppose it is.

Melody: Let's go and have a drink and a cake or something.

May: Okay.

(Brief music)

Melody: Okay.

Waitress: Yes madam.

(Brief music)

Melody: That's gorgeous May.

Salesgirl: It's top quality leather.

May: Okay... so it's either going to be this one... or this one... what do you

think?

Melody: Um, well I like that one myself.

May: Yes, I do too.

Salesgirl: That one is made of superior leather.

May: Do you accept credit cards?

Salesgirl: Oh yes Madam... of course we do.

(Brief music)

Melody: I'm feeling a bit tired now... shall we call it a day and go home.

May: Go home?! No way! Come on Melody... let's go and have something to

eat at Zuni's.

Melody: Zuni's? Wow, I've never eaten there before... they say the food's

fabulous but... it's a bit pricey.

May: Right... let's check it out.

(Brief music)

Melody: Mmm... that was delicious.

May: Waiter.... Bill please.

Waiter: Yes madam.

Melody: We've eaten so much.

May: You know what the Irish writer Oscar Wilde said Melody.

Melody: No, what did he say May?

May: I can resist anything... except... temptation.

Melody: (Laughing) He must have written that line for you May.

Waiter: Your bill Madam.

May: Do you accept credit cards?

Waiter: Of course madam.

May: Good.... Well where to next Melody?

Melody: My bed I think... I need to lie down and take a long rest after all that

shopping and eating.

May: You know I'm sick of my CD collection... let's just pop into H.V.M.

and see if they've got the sound track from Crouching Dragon Hidden

Lion.

Melody: Oh okay then....

(Brief music)

May: And that one I think.

Melody: Wow May... you've got ten CDs in your basket.

May: I haven't bought a CD for ages. Okay. Let's go.

(Brief music)

Salesgirl: Thank you madam.

May: Do you accept credit cards. Salesgirl: Oh yes, of course Madam.

Melody: Not until October.
